MORE FAIRTRADE INFORMATION: Why buy Fairtrade coffee? The livelihoods of 125m people worldwide depend on coffee – the boom and bust commodity. Production varies annually on weather and disease, so the market is inherently unstable and priced fluctuate widely. That volatility impacts directly on growers' incomes for household and farming needs. Fairtrade certification guarantees a Minimum Price to cover production costs and act as a safety net when market prices fall below sustainable levels and a Premium, 25% of which must enhance productivity & quality. In 2015 £38.6m were invested in farmer services and community projects (health, education, housing etc). Please support Fairtrade coffee farming communities by trying Fairtrade coffee. All Saints now uses good quality Fairtrade coffee - why not look for it when next shopping? On Tuesdays, during term time, from 10.30-2.00pm there is a Fairtrade Stall at the Central Baptist Church, Victoria Road South. There is also a catalogue and items can be ordered.
